2.5.2 – Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)

As the college is affiliated to Punjabi University Patiala, college is obligated to follow the guidelines established by the university with regard to student assessment conducted internally. To calculate the consolidated semester

grades, the internal assessment grades that were determined in this manner are added to the results of the semester-ending exams. Government Rajindra College focuses on encouraging a culture among educators that supports continual review of stakeholders and increases the productivity of their work by giving them a variety of logistical tools. Due to the way the semester system operates, each teaching day makes up a sizable chunk of the total amount of instruction for the semester. The institutions system for evaluating students is highly organized. Class tests, quizzes, seminars, and participation in class discussions that result in a consolidation of the underlying concepts learned in class are used as part of this ongoing review.

Academic calendar on the basis of University calendar is prepared at the beginning of the session and adhered to in order to provide best to the students. Mid semester tests are conducted in each semester and semester examination are held as per university guidelines. Efforts are made to organize seminars on different topics for the students in which resource persons from other institutions deliver lectures and interact with the students. This not only promotes the interest of the students but also gives them the opportunity to meet experts from diverse academics. To mark the celebrations of national and international importance, various seminars were scheduled.
